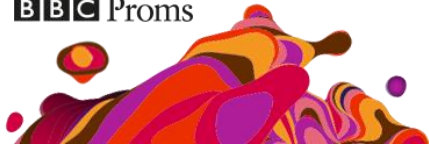

The BBC Proms is the largest classical music festival in the world, predominantly held at the Royal Albert Hall in London. The BBC Proms run over 100 live events a year at the festival and nearly all of them are broadcast on the BBC. In the same week in 2020 you could have experienced singer-songwriter Laura Marling; the London Symphony Orchestra and Sir Simon Rattle; and Anoushka Shankar, Gold Panda and the Britten Sinfonia. Its aim: to bring the best in classical music to the widest possible audience.

The mission of the BBC Concert Orchestra is to bring inspiring musical experiences to everyone, everywhere. The orchestra can be heard regularly on BBC Radio 2's Sunday Night Is Music Night, and for BBC Radio 3, BBC Sounds & BBC iPlayer it searches out the unusual and quirky, profiling classical masterpieces in an entertaining way. For TV, the orchestra has performed on soundtracks including Blue Planet and Serengeti.

The BBC Concert Orchestra is an Associate Orchestra at London's Southbank Centre and appears annually at the BBC Proms. The orchestra tours internationally and has an exciting programme of learning work, engaging people of all ages with a wide range of music and projects, including the BBC's Ten Pieces.
